


After graduating teaching school, Maddy got a job in Pulaski teaching first and second grades. She was paid \$100 a month. In 1941, Maddy married her true love, Lucian. A few months later her husband was drafted. Maddy tried to see her husband while he was stationed in California, but the base was on full-alert, so no one was allowed to leave. Lucian worked in the mail room and had other ideas. He wasn't going to miss out on seeing his new bride, so his friend stuffed him into a mail bag and "delivered" him to her hotel! Maddy quit teaching in 1946 when she became pregnant with her first child. They bought a home in Pulaski for \$18,000, and she stayed home to raise their five children. Maddy loved the theatre, going out to eat, and golfing. She also loved playing cards, and was in a Bridge club for over 60 years! She loved to bowl as well, and was on a bowling league for many years. Maddy has visited every state in the United States, except Texas. She has also been to Canada, Hawaii, Ireland, England, and South America. When the kids were grown, Maddy volunteered for the Red Cross, Meals-on-Wheels, and the Catholic Women's Society. She also volunteered at the school library, and was even the librarian for a year. A few years ago Maddy had the opportunity to ride in a car that drove itself.
